BE CROCWISE



- Always follow warning signs.
- Stay away from the water's edge.
- Don't clean fish, prepare food, or dispose of food scraps near the water's edge, on your boat or around your campsite.
- Stay alert when launching and retrieving your boat.
- Keep all of your body inside the vessel.
- Never enter the water to retrieve lures and always use a landing net.
- Camp at least 50m from the water's edge.

REMEMBER

- ▶ Crocodiles are dangerous and attacks can be fatal.
- ▶ Children and pets are especially at risk.
- ▶ **WARNING:** Crocodiles can still be around even if there are no signs.
- ▶ Crocodiles can stay hidden underwater for a long time. They will see you before you see them.
- ▶ Freshwater crocodiles can also become aggressive and cause serious injury if disturbed.

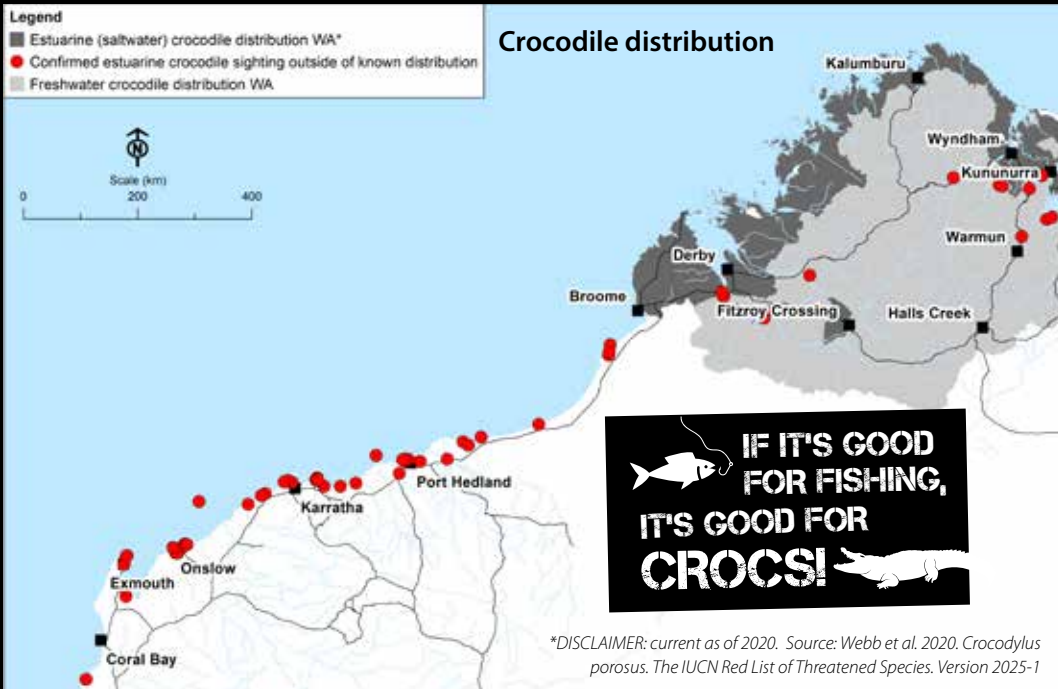

AUSTRALIA'S NORTH IS CROC COUNTRY



- ▶ Saltwater crocodiles can thrive in both salt and fresh water.
- ▶ They can be found hundreds of kilometres inland.
- ▶ Crocodiles are dangerous and attacks can be fatal.
- ▶ If a crocodile approaches you, move away immediately and keep a safe distance.
