There's no better way to discover the beauty and diversity of Western Australia than to explore its world-class parks.

Fees apply for entry, camping and special attractions in some of these parks. They assist in conservation and park management including the improvement of visitor services and facilities.

Park passes can be bought online, are great value for money and offer a convenient alternative to paying entry fees.

Enjoy your park visits knowing that you have made a valuable contribution to the management of these special areas.

Park entry fees

Entry fees cover vehicle entry to all parks on a single day*.

- Holders of park passes and visitors who walk or cycle into a park do not need to pay entry fees.
- Instructions for payment are given at park entrances.

Motorcycles

\$10 per motorcycle.

Private vehicles with up to 12 legally seated occupants including the driver.

\$17 per vehicle \$10 concession per vehicle

Private vehicles with 13 or more legally seated occupants including the driver.

\$8 per occupant \$3.50 per concession occupant

* Separate entry fees must be paid at both Yanchep and Nambung national parks when entering in a private vehicle with 13 or more occupants.

Which parks have entry fees?

North West	Bandilgan (Windjana Gorge), Dimalurru (Tunnel Creek), Karijini, Millstream Chichester, Mirima, Purnululu and Wolfe Creek Meteorite Crater national parks and Wunaamin Conservation Park.
Coral Coast	Cape Range, François Péron, Kalbarri, Lesueur and Nambung national parks.
Around Perth	Avon Valley, John Forrest, Serpentine, Walyunga, and Yanchep national parks and Lane Poole Reserve.
Golden Outback	Cape Arid, Cape Le Grand and Stokes national parks.
South West	D'Entrecasteaux, Fitzgerald River, Gloucester, Greater Beedelup, Porongurup, Shannon, Stirling Range, Torndirrup, Warren and West Cape Howe national parks and Two Peoples Bay Nature Reserve.

Holiday Pass

Three Holiday Pass options each provide unlimited entry to all parks and are the best value for holidays and short breaks.

Annual All Parks Pass

Enjoy unlimited entry to all parks for 12 months

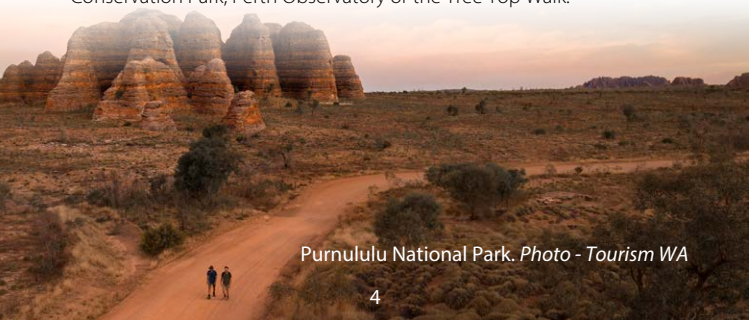

Annual Local Park Pass

Local residents and rate payers can make the most of unlimited entry to favourite local parks for 12 months.

1 year \$30

- Passes are available online, at Parks and Wildlife Service offices and selected tourist outlets and visitor centres.
- Passes must be displayed in vehicle windows. Passes bought online need to be printed for display.
- Passes can only be used for private vehicles with up to 12 legally seated occupants including the driver.
- A pass can be used with two different vehicles but only one vehicle at a time.
- Passes cannot be used for camping or to enter the Avon Descent; Giants, Calgardup, Crystal or Cabaret caves; Araluen Botanic Park; Dryandra Woodland; Dangggu Geikie Gorge boat trip; Monkey Mia Conservation Park; Perth Observatory or the Tree Top Walk.

Camping fees

Camping fees are paid per person per night and vary with the level of facilities provided at the campground. Entry fees also need to be paid, in parks where they apply, but only for the day of arrival.

Example: 2 adults x \$15 adult fee x 4 nights + 1 x \$17 entry fee = \$137.

- Campers may leave and re-enter a park during their stay without paying further entry fees.
- Holders of park passes do not need to pay entry fees.
- Camping opportunities provided by commercial operators have separate fees and booking arrangements.

How much are the camping fees?

Without facilities

Adult \$10 Concession \$7 Child \$5

Campgrounds with basic facilities (such as toilets, picnic tables, barbecues or fire pits)

Adult \$15 Concession \$10 Child \$5

Campgrounds with additional facilities (such as ablutions, showers or shelters)

Adult \$20 Concession \$15 Child \$5

Bandilngan (Windjana Gorge), Purnululu and Wolfe Creek Meteorite Crater national parks and Wunaamin Conservation Park -without facilities.

Adult \$15 Concession \$12.50 Child \$4.50

Attraction fees

These special experiences and tours in have separate fees.

Valley of the Giants Tree Top Walk

Entry to the 600m elevated walkway daily 9am to 4.15pm or 9am to 6.15pm from 26 December to 26 January. Closed 25 December and in hazardous conditions. No charge for the Ancient Empire guided walk. Booking not required.

Danggu Geikie Gorge National Park boat trip

Boat trips depart at various days and times from the end of April to November. Please check departure times with the Parks and Wildlife Service Broome office on (08) 9195 5500. Booking advised. Book online at exploreparcs.dbca.wa.gov.au/park/danggu-geikie-gorge-national-park.

Monkey Mia Conservation Park

Dolphin experiences can occur up to three times a day between 7.45am and 12pm. It is best to arrive by 7.45am. Booking not required. Passes can be purchased in advance at exploreparcs.dbca.wa.gov.au/park/monkey-mia-conservation-park.

Leeuwin-Naturaliste National Park

Self-guided cave tours are available daily except 25 and 26 December.

Calgardup Cave is easily accessed on boardwalks and stairs and suitable for all ages. Giants Cave is a medium-level adventure caving experience with ladders, rock scrambles and tight spots. Booking not required.

Yanchep National Park

Crystal Cave Tours run five times per day at 10am, 11am, 1pm, 2pm and 3pm. The 'Aboriginal Cultural Experience' is available on Sundays and public holidays at 2pm and 3pm. Booking advised at the park or online. Check for other times and make private or group bookings at exploreparks.dbca.wa.gov.au/park/yanchep-national-park.

Concessions

Concession rate fees and passes are available to holders of Australian issued cards and recipients of the payments and allowances listed here:

- Seniors Card • Age Pension • Disability Support (Blind) • Disability Support
- Carer Payment • Carer Allowance • Department of Veterans' Affairs (DVA)
- Companion Card

The accompanying companion/carer of a Companion Card holder is entitled to free camping and entry where 'per person' fees apply.

Children and families

Child fees apply to children aged from 6 to 15 years. There are no fees for children aged 5 years or younger.

Family fees at attractions include 2 adults and 2 children.

Fee waivers and reductions

Community groups travelling on buses may be entitled to a reduction in fees and should check with local Parks and Wildlife Service offices. Organised outings for education and study groups, groups of people with disability and aged or infirm groups, accompanied by their carers, may be eligible for an entry fee waiver. Requests for consideration of fee waivers can be made to park.passes@dbca.wa.gov.au or on (08) 9219 8411 at least two weeks before the intended date of entry.

Holders of recreational fishing licences may enter a park at no charge if entering for the purpose of the licence.
